## Milford Haven Town Council Annual Report

## Introduction

Outline of Council	<ul> <li>Milford Haven Town Council serves the area of Milford Haven and its population of around 13,500 residents. It has 18 councillors, covering six wards: Central, East, Hakin, Hubberston, North and West. As democratically elected local representatives, the councillors have a unique and privileged position and the potential to make a real difference to people's lives.</li> <li>Milford Haven Town Council is the level of government closest to the community, with Pembrokeshire County Council above it in hierarchy.</li> <li>The Town Council employs 4 fulltime members of staff: Two admin staff and two Cemetery staff.</li> <li>The Training Plan for Councillor and staff is available on the town council website.</li> </ul>

## Financial Summary 2022-2023

The Council precept is the main source of income and represents the amount of council tax paid by households in Milford Haven that is allocated to the Town Council. The annual precept (£31.92 per Band D household) raised a total of £174,284 for the Town Council during 2022 / 2023. The Town Council also received other income of £105,163.
